TIPS FOR WINTER DRIVING

Irish Rail Strike

Essential Information for Driving in Bad Weather Conditions

Vision—Through the winter months dazzle from the low winter sun can be a particular problem.

Improve vision significantly by making sure that your windscreen is clean - inside and out. Use air conditioning for faster demisting and to reduce condensation on cold windows.

Check windscreen wipers and replace if necessary.

Make sure that wipers are switched off in the park position when leaving the car when there is a risk of freezing as failure to do so could damage the blades or wiper motor when you turn the ignition on if the blades have frozen to the screen.

Windscreen washer fluid should be topped up and treated with a proprietary additive to reduce the chance of freezing in frosty weather.

headlights are clean and aimed correctly.

You must use headlights when visibility is seriously reduced. You may also use front or rear fog lights but these must be switched off when visibility improves as they can dazzle other road users and obscure your brake lights.

Tyres—Check all tyres for condition and pressure. Get up at least 10 minutes earlier to give you time to prepare your vehicle.

Don't drive off like a tank-commander, with a tiny hole cleared in your windscreen. Clear all windows of snow and ice using a scraper and de-icer.

Put safety before punctuality when the bad weather closes in. While it's always a good idea to allow extra time in winter for your journey, drivers must accept the inevitability of being late for work if they are caught up in an unexpected delay.

<u>Driving on Icy Roads</u> —Gentle manoeuvres are the key to safe driving.

Select second gear when pulling away, easing your foot off the clutch gently to avoid wheel-spin.

Leave as much room as possible between you and **Email:** the car in front.

Always apply brakes gently. Release them and de- vember 2017 clutch if the car skids.

As we are all aware Irish Rail have 5 days strikes planned during the months on November 2017 and December 2017. The planned days of strike are as follows;

1—1st November 2017

2-7th November 2017

3-14th November 2017

4-23rd November 2017

5-8th December 2017

It is important that all employees who use the rail service make alternative arrangements on these days.

Employees who use other forms of public transport should factor in the large volumes of individuals that will use these services on strike days and leave Visibility—Check that all bulbs are working and that enough time to arrive on time to work. All 5 days are normal working days.
